Principal's Report

Information regarding Renaissance Adventure Day (RAD):

- RAD will take place on Friday, 10/05
- RAD Committee Leads: Lore and Brenda
- REMS will have lunch as a school outside and will close together outside with music.
- The day's schedule will be finalized soon, but will be broken into the following parts:
 - Adventure Challenges: These will be all about adventure education (tent building, hole digging, etc.). Students will rotate among various activities. Events will be specific to age/grade level.
 - Visual Arts: Students will be creating an art installation (possibly for RSS) as the service project. The
 "service" is building community. Idea included using hula hoops and sheets for a weaving design. Funds will be needed (approximately a couple hundred \$), but will be discussed at next meeting.
 - Performing Arts: Mr. Josh will transform the performing arts room into a garage for a STOMP theme where students can participate in various activities related to STOMP.
 - o Mr. Doug will be Earthball games.
 - o Drumming Station: Students will drum and learn a song.
 - o Minute-to-Win-It: Students will participate in various quick-acting games with their crew in their classroom.
- Teachers will designing the games this year.
- Students will be provided with:
 - o T-Shirt
 - Rubber bracelet (Renaissance RAD with four components of the circle of courage)
- Volunteer Information:
 - Volunteer training will take place on Wednesday, October 3rd.
 - Volunteers will receive PolarTek water bottles (in lieu of disposable plastic water bottles)
 - Volunteers will be encouraged to bring a sack lunch and to eat lunch outside with the students (in lieu of a purchased/catered lunch)
 - Committee Leads can get snacks donated
 - Volunteers may receive t-shirts depending on cost, etc. Will be determined at a later date.

Life is Art:

- Life is Art will be held on Saturday, March 2nd at Cielo's (same location as last year)
- Josh Rigo will be the auctioneer
- Points of discussion/consideration:
 - Find a better time for the band to be playing, possibly later in the night.
 - Share the auction items a few days before event, but not open up bidding until the night of.
 - Change seating for more movement but still have enough seating.
 - Continue using the Handbid app.
 - Revisit how to get people through the check-out line more efficiently (or if the check-out line in needed)
 - Less items to bid on
 - Have a theme for the event (Great Gatsby)
 - o In addition to the silent auction, live auction, and the crew artwork, have each crew OR each grade create a themed basket to be auctioned. (Elise will reach out to Shannan A. and Courtney H. about this)

Miscellaneous from Deborah:

- REA discussed a grant process and the mechanics of how it will work
 - W-9 form for anything over \$600, a specific grant form needed, detailed invoices
 - Needed for events such as:
 - Love and Logic course
 - Adventure Ed financial support
 - Monthly birthday cakes

Officer Reports

Treasurer's Report:

- Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Sheet shared

Secretary's Report:

Box Top Program:

- Instead of the Scrips program we will focus on participating in the King Soopers Neighborhood rewards program.

Committee Updates

Back to School Carnival:

- Carnival was a success and was well-organized
- Carnival raised \$750 during the teacher fundraiser. \$50 was gifted to each teacher participant for use in their classroom.
- Carnival ended up with \$600 profit.
- Points of discussion/consideration:
 - Carnival committee asked to purchase an advertising flag for \$160. REA feels like the event is so early in the school year the flag would not be used but for a short time and not necessary.
 - Some items to think about for next year:
 - How can we come out more even and not have such a large profit (since it is not technically a school fundraiser). Are there areas where we can no longer charge for participation?
 - Should the teachers continue to receive individual funds, or should the money made with the Pie Face game be available to all teachers or be available for grants?

New Business

REA Storage:

- Committee Leads need space for storage-especially the Back-to-School-Carnival
- REA discussed various options for meeting the storage needs and being cost efficient.
 - o Deborah will make space in one of the existing sheds on campus for the carnival committee to use.
 - All storage items need to be labeled in tupperware

OLE Budget:

- This year the focus will be on a work day maintenance without spending additional money.
- Some crews will be doing service learning projects that focus on the OLE. Examples: Painting mobiles, creating a mountain bike trail)
 - Crews may need REA funds in the future for these service learning projects.

Crew Wear:

- There is a strong interest for parent t-shirts.
- Tech-Tees for students (so they may be taken on voyages), non-tech tees for adults
- Interest in finding affordable rain gear that the younger students can access.
